A14. NC-075 Cadet Duty/Job Position Cord Addendum

A14.1. Cords are worn to signify certain duty positions or membership in certain teams. They are temporary in nature. Like temporary rank, when a cadet leaves a duty position or team, they must turn in the corresponding cord.

A14.1.2. Cords are worn on the left shoulder of the light blue shirt or the Class A uniform jacket.

A14.1.3. The following cadet duty positions and team membership wear cords:

Group Commander: Gold w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Deputy Group Commander: Old Gold w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Executive Officer: Red w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Command Chief Master Sergeant: Gold w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Operations Squadron Commander: Purple and Gray w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Mission Support Sq. Commander: Jay Blue and Buff w/ 2 Commander nickel whistle

Deputy Operations Sq. Commander: Gold w/ 2 Commander brass whistle

Deputy Mission Support Sq. Commander: Gold w/ 2 Commander brass whistle

Group First Sergeant: Yellow w/ 1 Commanders nickel whistle

Special Teams Flight Commander: Maroon w/ 1 Commanders nickel whistle

Director of Flight Operations: Yellow w/ 2 Commanders nickel whistle

Chief of Chaplains: Teal w/ 2 Commanders nickel whistle

Group Shoulder Cords

A14.2. Cadets assigned to various positions of responsibility within the cadet group will wear the appropriate shoulder cord corresponding to their position. Cords will be worn on the left shoulder. A cadet may wear only one cord at a time on the uniform. Cords are NOT worn on the windbreaker. Cadet group positions and descriptions of corresponding shoulder cords, in order of precedence, are as follows:

- A14.2.1. Group Commander: *Gold**
- A14.2.2. Deputy Group Commander: *Old Gold**
- A14.2.3. Executive Officer: *Red**
- A14.2.4. Command Chief: *Gold**
- A14.2.5. Operations Squadron Commander: *Purple and Gray**
- A14.2.6. Mission Support Squadron Commander: *Jay Blue and Buff**
- A14.2.7. Deputy Operations Squadron Commander: *Gold**
- A14.2.8. Deputy Mission Support Squadron Commander: *Gold**
- A14.2.9. First Sergeant: *Yellow**
- A14.2.10. Chief of Chaplains: *Teal**
- A14.2.11. Superintendents for both Operations and Mission Support Squadron: Purple**
- A14.2.12. Special Teams Flight Commander: *Maroon**
- A14.2.13. Drill Team Commander: Maroon and Gold**
- A14.2.14. Color Guard Commander: Maroon and Gold**
- A14.2.15. Kitty Hawk Honor Society Commander: Jay Blue**
- A14.2.16. Raider Team Commander: Maroon and Gold**
- A14.2.17. Orienteering: Maroon and Gold**
- A14.2.18. Director of Flight Operations: *Yellow**
- A14.2.19. Flight Commander: Blue and Black**
- A14.2.20. Flight Sergeants: Blue**
- A14.2.21. Director of Logistics: Metallic Gold**
- A14.2.22. Director of Personnel: Buff**
- A14.2.23. Chief of Public Affairs: Silver**
- A14.2.24. Drill Team Members: Maroon**
- A14.2.25. Color Guard Members: *Silver when they do a color guard**
- A14.2.26. Cadet Of The Month (four; Airman/JNCO/SNCO/Officer): Jay Blue**
- A14.2.27. Cadet Of The Quarter (four; Airman/JNCO/SNCO/Officer): Infantry Blue**
- A14.2.28. Cadet Of The Year (four; Airman/JNCO/SNCO/Officer): Medium Blue**
- A14.2.29. Outstanding Cadet (three; ASI/II/III): Royal Blue**

NOTE: * means they have whistle(s)

NOTE: Cadets of the Month/Quarter/Year/Outstanding Cadet Ribbon Recipient will wear their perspective cord on the left shoulder

NOTE: When a cadet no longer holds one of the positions listed above, he/she will return the cord to the ASI.

A14.3. SHOULDER TABS

A13.3.1. Shoulder tabs are cloth or metal arches denoting participation in a JROTC activity. Cadets are authorized to wear one shoulder tab on the right shoulder of the service dress coat, lightweight blue jacket and the light blue shirt, centered between the unit patch and the shoulder seam. Tabs will have the name of the activity on them (e.g., *drill team, saber team, honor guard, etc.*). If no unit patch is worn, tab should be worn 1 inch below the shoulder seam. If a unit patch is worn, shoulder tab should be centered between the unit patch and the shoulder seam. Shoulder tabs are optional. SASI designates which activities will be denoted by shoulder tabs and set the criteria for each.

A14.3.2. Honor Guard - “*The best of the best.*” In order to receive this tab; you must accomplish the following: two Sabre Guard Events, ten Color Guard Events, and finally compete in two Drill Team Events such as Strike Eagle and RS Central Academic and Drill competition, etc..

A14.3.3. Drill Team - Must be on Drill Team; attended 15 drill team practices, and competed at one Drill Team Event. Finally, he/she must be able to command the *30 Step Drill Sequence*.

A14.3.4. Rifle Team - Must be on the Marksmanship Team and must have attended 15 Marksmanship Team Practices; and must pass a weapons safety test.

(NOTE: Weapons Safety Test is being finalized.)

A14.3.5. Color Guard - Must be on Color Guard, and must have attended 15 Color Guard Events; and have attended one Drill Event.

A14.3.6. Raider - Must be on Raider Team, attended 15 Raider Team Practices; and competed at one Raider Event.

A14.3.7. Raider Challenge - Must have competed in one Raider Event
