

A3.1—NC-075 Male & Female Optional Uniform Headgear

A3.1. Any beret issued to a cadet must be approved by both the SASI and Air Force JROTC Headquarters.

A3.2. Cadets authorized to wear a beret will maintain required criteria as outlined below:

A3.2.1. Drill Team members wear a black beret with a yellow letter "T." Members must meet all requirements as outlined in Chapter 1: paragraph 10.8.1.7.

A3.2.2. RAIDER Team members wear a red/maroon beret with a yellow letter "T." Members must meet all requirements as outlined in Chapter 1 Operations; paragraph 8.12.5.

A3.2.3. Color Guard members are authorized to wear white berets with a black or yellow colored letter "T."

A3.2.4. Command Staff positions may be approved by the SASI with the recommendation of the Group Command Staff to wear a black beret.

A3.2.4.1. Cadet Corps Staff/Duty positions are usually for cadets who are not on any Special Team identified in the aforementioned notes. These cadets will use their rank insignia in lieu of the letter "T." Their rank will be centered inside a black with yellow trimmed flash patch only.

A3.2.4.2. Currently, the NC-075 allows these positions to wear a beret as outlined in A3.2.4.1.: Group Staff team members; both Operations and Mission Support Squadron Commanders and their deputy commanders.

A3.3. Cadets will be responsible for filling a hand receipt for beret.

A3.5. Cadets who are members on Special Teams such as Drill and Raider must wear their issued beret when competing in events.


A3.5.1. In some cases, newly assigned members may not have an issued beret; in this event, they will wear the regulation flight cap.

A3.5.2. Cadets on Special Teams have the choice to wear either the regulation flight cap or the issued beret.

A3.6. Cadets are responsible for the proper cleaning and maintenance of their issued uniform items especially berets. Cadets are responsible for the shaping their issued beret.



3.7. U.S. AIR FORCE SERVICE CAP (aka. 'Wheel caps')

3.7.1. Wheel caps are only authorized for designated (AS-4) cadets. These students are typically seniors and are given this privilege as a special honor to recognize their service in the Cadet Corps.

3.7.2. The only designated (AS-4) cadets are officers and the Command Chief; if applicable.

3.7.3. May be worn in place of regulation flight cap or issued beret.

3.7.4. If SAIS approved; this cap may be worn on any uniform day.

3.7.5. NOTE: The U.S. Air Force Service Cap must have the authorized cap device (officer or enlisted) insignia attached.

3.8. U.S. Air Force Honor Guard Cap (aka. 'Hap Arnold'). Color Guard members are authorized to wear specified 'Hap Arnold's' caps.

3.9. Airman Battle Uniform (ABU) Headgear. Authorized ABU headgear must be worn by cadets when wearing ABU's.

3.9.1. Officer Rank insignia will be centered bottom and top.

3.9.2. No other insignia/rank/badge will be worn on ABU headgear.

3.9.3. Hair grooming standards is the same as the other uniform regulations.

3.10. Chrome Plated Parade Helmets (plastic or metal) (aka. 'Chrome Domes')

3.10.1. 'Chrome domes' are primarily worn by the Color Guard.

3.10.2. However, members of the Drill team may also wear them during special events such as parades, special flag folding ceremonies, saber team events such as annual Homecoming event, or any other special event designated by the SASI.

3.1.7 Air Force Junior ROTC Officer (Rank) Insignia.



Due to inventory availability, AFJROTC Officer (Rank) Insignia is primarily issued to cadet officers who are not issued either a 'Wheel Cap' or a special designated beret. These cadet officers will affix the officers' insignia to the standard issued flight cap.
